Request to Wood-Perry Ditch Company (WPDC)

To the 2025 WPDC board of directors (recusing myself):

As the owner of Lot#21 in the Dallas Meadows HOA, I am requesting that the main mean of water transportation for the irrigation water going through my property will now be using the newly installed pipeline rather than the existing open earth ditches. As a precaution and to ensure the functionality of the new pipeline, I will keep the existing ditches in place for at least a year as a backup solution.

The use of the pipeline will provide a more efficient way to distribute the water from many aspects such as reduced losses through seepage and evaporation, faster delivery after setup changeover, reduced maintenance and increased safety for the operators.

The underground pipeline is designed to carry much more water than our deeded amount. The deeded water rights for all combined users of the WPDC is about 2 cubic feet per second (CFS). Per the engineering design the pipeline can carry a minimum total of 6.4 CFS. That is 3.76 CFS on the diagonal branch and 2.63 CFS on the south branch.

An operating manual for the pipeline will be published on the WPDC website prior to the 2025 irrigation season.
