Hi Tom and Brenda,

I got the last payment from the NRCS and we are done with the project (minus final touches I have to do).

I will go ahead and put money back into the WPDC account and here is what I propose:

We started last year with a balance of \$65,379.85

All I would like to ask the WPDC is reimbursement for my direct expenses and I will give away all my work as volunteering as well as all the cash I floated to move the project forward since we only got reimbursed by NRCS after completion.

My expenses are as follows:

- \$7,902: Rental fee my tractor and all equipment that were use during the installation. (based on the exact same cost paid for the Mini excavator rental).
- \$335: Mileage for all the back and forth to vendors. (500 miles X \$0.67)
- \$231.25: Annual website registration fees (unrelated to the pipeline but accrued expense)
- \$213.28: Wireless flume water level sensor \$213.28 (electronic hardware only, time as volunteer)
- \$25: Annual CO corporation registration

Total expenses: \$8,706.53

So I would return \$56,673.32 to the WPDC bank account.
